### Making Woodland House a reality

We have been able to break ground on the UK's first standalone bereavement centre in a hospital setting, following a successful £3m charity appeal.

Our hospital cares for over 2,000 families every year who experience pregnancy or baby loss. Due to limited space, heart-breaking conversations take place in rooms and locations which don't reflect the significance of their loss. Woodland House will change that. When complete this Autumn, Woodland House will be a safe haven for bereaved families away from the hustle and bustle of the busy maternity unit, allowing families to grieve in private.

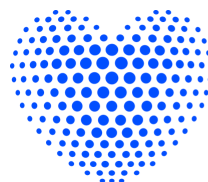
We believe bereavement aftercare must be better for our devastated families and our pioneering bereavement centre will lead the way, acting as a blueprint for hospitals up and down the country.

Lynette Parkes discovered her baby boy, James, had died, during a scan. He was stillborn seven months into her pregnancy. She said: “It can't be underestimated just what a difference having Woodland House will make to families during the worst time of their lives.
